



TIP: Mix and match event ideas and incorporate them into a single fundraiser. Auctions are always an easy addition to any gala or a-thon event, especially when you use digital fundraising tools.



Fundraising Event Ideas

Races and "A-Thons"

A-thons and races are great ways to raise money and awareness while deeply connecting with the local community. You can charge participants a registration fee as well as encourage them to obtain sponsors willing to donate in support of their performance.

Bowl-a-thon – Community members receive donations based on how many strikes and spares they roll.

Color Run – People run in clouds of rainbow colors!

Dance-a-thon – Participants dance for as long as they can and receive donations based on how long they keep dancing.

Hike-a-Thon – People from the community hike nature trails and raise money per unit distance they cover.

Jog-a-thon – This is the same idea as a walka-thon, but participants jog instead of walk.

Math-a-thon – Guests attempt multiple math problems and receive donations for each one they get correct.

Mini-Triathlon – Participants test their stamina in this miniature version of a race that involves a half mile of swimming, 15 miles of biking, and 3 miles of running, back to-back. People can even create teams of 3 with each person dedicated to one leg of the course (relay-race style) if they're not so sure about completing the challenge solo.

Read-a-thon – Kids read and collect donations based on how long they read for, how many books they read, or how many pages they read during the contest period. **Spell-a-thon** – All ages compete to spell as many words as possible and receive donations for each word spelled correctly in a certain time.

Superhero 5/10k – Kids and adults love dressing up together to run for a great cause. This event is flexible and works well as an in person, hybrid, or completely remote event.

Walk-a-thon – Walkers stroll along a path and raise money per unit distance they cover in a certain amount of time. Alternatively, people may walk laps and receive donations per lap.



Other Tournament and Contest Ideas for Non-Pledge Revenue

Supporters can enjoy watching and participating in any number of these competitive fundraising ideas. Tournament and contest fundraisers typically bring in large and diverse crowds, so you raise the bulk of your funds with ticket sales.

Battle of the Bands – Bands from the community compete for Best in Town.

Board Games – Board games like chess, Scrabble®, Battleship®, and Uno® are a good bet for keeping spectators engaged on the sidelines.

Escape Room – Places like the cafeteria, gymnasium, library, auditorium, and classrooms are rife with escape room possibilities.

Family Feud – Create your own template or choose from plenty of free templates online.

Golf or Mini Golf – Ask local businesses to sponsor a hole and highlight their logos along the course.

Hoops, Homeruns, and Goals – Whether you measure success by accuracy or rent a radar gun to measure success by speed instead, this tournament style is versatile and adapts to any sport.

Jell-O[®], Ramen Noodle, or Pudding

Fighting – Get messy for a great cause. All you need: A few kiddy pools, slippery or slimy food cheap enough to buy in bulk, and a handful of ground rules. This one is a bit unusual but lots of fun for wrestlers and spectators alike.

Karaoke Sing-off – Award prizes in categories like Best Duet, Best Group, and Best Solo.

Lawn or Beach Games – Cornhole, giant Jenga, giant checkers, lawn bowling, Kan Jam, volleyball, badminton—you name it!

Lego® Extravaganza – Give individuals or teams the same number of Lego, set a timer, and they can draw up blueprints and create masterpieces right in front of the guests.

Judges hand out awards for Most Creative,
Best Execution, and more.

Sample Lego competition prompts

Adjust the difficulty level based on the age of the participants

Create a 3-course meal – Get tummies rumbling.

Design an extravagant fairytale castle - Add moats, drawbridges, horse-drawn carriages, and other impressive details.

Dive deep into an underwater world made of bricks – Bonus points to the structure that holds water for the longest amount of time.

Recreate a scene from an iconic adventure movie – Let imaginations run wild.

Take a crack at designing the sturdiest bridge

– The last structure standing after enduring
simulated earthquakes that grow in intensity
every round, wins.

Murder Mystery – Which team can solve the mystery first?

Paintball or Capture the Flag -

From playgrounds to tennis courts, it's easy to create interesting courses throughout the community.

Pet Talent Show or Community

Talent Show – Hidden talents and adorable pets: What's not to love?

Ping Pong – This fast-paced game is fun for all skill levels and ages.

Pub Games – Darts, pool, foosball, air hockey, and shuffleboard are as much fun to watch from the sidelines as they are to participate in.

Scavenger Hunt – Nearby parks make perfect environments for this high-energy fundraiser. **Trivia Night** – Kids versus adults!

Upcycled Fashion Show – Have people design clothing from recycled materials and create a catwalk in a large common area like a community theater or a park on a nice day.

Video Games – Use the computer room at your local library or set up a bunch of televisions in different classrooms at a school for an indoor tournament-style fundraiser that draws large crowds regardless of the weather.

[Your Town's] Greatest Baker or an Iron Chef-style Cook-off — Baking and cooking competitions are popular to watch and participate in. You can follow the structure of one of the television shows or go rogue; if you provide scrumptious treats for guests to taste-test, this fundraiser will have the community lining up at the doors to get in.



Galas Galore

If you're looking for ways to shake up this traditional black-tie event, here's a list of fresh and fun gala themes that'll have everyone talking about the great experience.

Alice in Wonderland

- Suggested Decorations: Giant mushroom cutouts, hookahs, fog and bubble machines, lights that change color, petit fours with "Try Me" written on top, lawn flamingos
- **Suggested Activities:** Decorate-your-own teapot, chess, croquet, limbo

American Holiday Mashup

A compellation of what Americans enjoy about the most mainstream holidays.

- Suggested Decorations: Valentine's Daythemed cards and flowers, Independence Day sparklers, Halloween decor, Christmas trees
- Suggested Activities: Pictures with the
 Easter Bunny and Santa, trick-or-treating,
 Thanksgiving dinner or July 4th cookout,
 pumpkin carving contest, menorah
 lighting, watching the ball drop at the
 end of the night

Arcade Night or Retro Video Game Night

- Suggested Decorations: Large cardboard cutouts of well-known video game characters, pixelated tablecloths, neon signs
- Suggested Activities: Video and arcade games, competition-style racing games projected onto a large screen, Mariothemed obstacle course

Casino Night

Charitable gambling is legal on a state-bystate basis, so make sure to check what the rules are in your state.

- Suggested Decorations: Beaded curtains (but with fake gold coins instead of beads), televisions with recordings of poker tournaments playing, card-themed art, bouquets of fake flowers folded from losing scratch tickets
- Suggested Activities: Gambling, darts, pool

Comedy Night

- Suggested Decorations:

 Posters of comedy movies,
 pictures of famous comedians,
 funny masks, gag gifts like
 whoopee cushions and finger traps
- Suggested Activities: Stand-up comedy routines, funny hypnotists, open mic for best jokes guests have ever heard, cartoon character-drawing artist

Glow Up

- Suggested Decorations: Blacklights and neon everywhere, glowsticks, washable glow-in-the-dark paint (safe for skin, table clothes, and walls that are covered by giant sheets of paper), neon rainbow confetti
- **Suggested Activities:** Laser light show, Lite Brite[™] picture/design competition

Ice Palace

- Suggested Decorations: Project the northern lights onto the ceiling, hang snowflake lamps, fake snow, snow globes, ice sculptures
- Suggested Activities: Air hockey, live ice sculpture carving, ice skating

Luau Night

- Suggested Decorations: Hibiscus flowers, fresh hibiscus leis, model volcanos, pineapple décor
- Suggested Activities: Firewalking, hula lessons, fire dancers, dinner cooked over an open flame, paper lantern release

Out of This World

- Suggested Decorations: Meteor shower and star constellation projector, hanging planet and star lanterns
- Suggested Activity: All headsets that make guests feel like they're hopping around mars or the moon, outer-spacethemed photo booth

Paint the Town

- Suggested Decorations: Paintings
 by local and famous artists, painting
 pallets in place of plates, canvas-style
 tablecloths, vases filled with brushes and
 watercolors on every table
- Suggested Activity: Paint Night, paint room where guests put on old clothing or smocks and "paint" an abstract mural with hands, feet, and random tools on a waterproof cloth/canvas secured across the floor

Secret Garden

- Suggested Decorations: Flowers, framed quotes from the Secret Garden movie, decorative wire bird cages, vines of ivy
- Suggested Activities: Hedgerow maze, teatime and biscuits, croquet, create your own planters (like Paint Night but with plants)

Stars of the Silver Screen

- **Suggested Decorations:** Red carpet, photo booths, photographers dressed as paparazzi walking around and taking photos, big "diamonds" (plastic) as part of tablescapes
- **Suggested Activity:** Hollywood-themed trivia night (every table is a team)

Superhero Soiree

- Suggested Decorations: Cityscape silhouettes, origami flower bouquets made from superhero comic book pages, fog machines, Batman floodlights that turn on and land on winning bidders during/if you have a live auction
- Suggested Activities: Arm wrestling, create-your-own comic strip, super-hero photobooth

Under the Sea

- Suggested Decorations: Fish tanks, seashells, fish nets, ship and mermaid décor, water fountains
- **Suggested Activities:** Seafood dinner, sand dollar painting, sea glass art

If you're getting ready to put on a gala, peer-to-peer or community event, or any fundraiser with an auction, this list of 120+ awesome fundraiser auction item ideas have your name written all over it.



TIP: Whatever is on your items wishlist, supplement it with as many "experiences" as possible. Items that offer a truly unique experience are super attractive. People bid more for items they can't easily buy on their own. There's also a lot of scientific research that shows people value experiences more than possessions, so make sure you have fun, exclusive, and exciting items to make your auction stand out.

Local Experiences

Local experiences fit that niche of people looking to get out and do something fun without interrupting too much school or waiting until springing for a full vacation. Think outside the box and offer individualized opportunities that aren't available to the general public, such as private tours.

- Complimentary week at a nearby summer camp – This is both fun for kids and nice for their parents.
- Guided horseback trail ride Especially in areas with nice trails and gorgeous views.
- Indoor rock climbing or skydiving –
 Although they are indoors, they still offer a ton of excitement.
- Interactive experiences at the closest
 aquarium Aquariums often hold special,
 after-hours events that make for
 memorable time.
- Laser light shows A fun sensory experience.
- Make a Mosaic party Create coasters, picture frames, vases, and more with a variety of colors and stones.

- Museum passes and tours Some museums offer special guest packages.
- **Mushroom foraging** There are experts and local tours all over the country.
- Paintball Find a local course near you.
- Paint-your-own pottery experience Choose from different containers and shapes.
- **Plant Night** Like Paint Night but with beautiful little planters instead.
- Season tickets to a local professional or college sports team – Season tickets are a gift that keeps on giving.
- **Zoo Lights tickets** If your town or city has a nearby zoo, it's likely to have its own version of Zoo Lights.

It's easier than ever for people to follow their passions, develop new hobbies in their off-hours, and sell their goods, thanks to online shops like Etsy. Plus, when the community supports fundraising events, it's extra nice to support creative projects close to home in kind.

- Experience of doing a project with a local YouTube Video Maker There are thousands of incredibly talented people across the country who make a living off "views" when they share videos of their project ideas on YouTube.
 - See if a YouTube Video Maker with ties to your community will partner with your team and create a one-of-a-kind auction item for your event. Promotion on a popular YouTube channel would be a boost for your fundraiser, and YouTube Video Makers often need project ideas so they can keep making money off views: a win-win!
- Handmade home décor Fresh wreaths, indoor planters, candle holders, picture frames, welcome mats, and even throw pillows add a nice touch to the home.
- Handmade quilts or weighted blankets Who doesn't love wrapping up in a warm blanket after a long day in the winter?
- Homemade candles, body lotions, and soaps – Fresh scents with a local flare make for appealing items.

- **Homemade jewelry** Handmade jewelry is often eye-catching and one-of-a-kind.
- Local honey or maple syrup A great way to sweeten any dessert, tea, or breakfast.
- **Local spices** Fresh spices add dimension and complexity to any dish.
- Upcycled totes and purses Look for creativity and style that is kind to the environment.



Classes Outside of the Classroom

Who doesn't like to learn something new? The great thing about auctioning classes and lessons is that it is sometimes easier to get local individuals or businesses to offer time donations than it is to get money or objects. Offering lessons on auction can also generate interest and boost their business simultaneously – making it a win-win. You can make packages more enticing by getting local or national celebrities to deliver the lessons. How do cooking lessons with the best chef in the county sound?

Archery classes – It's fun and surprisingly easy for most people to pick up after only one class.

Cooking or cake decorating lessons – Impress guests at the next bake sale.

Crocheting or Knitting lessons – They'll be creating their own blankets in no time.

Dance lessons – Merengue? Belly? Square? Ballroom?

Gardening lessons – Keep those tomatoes full and flavorful.

Golf lessons – Throw in new golf clubs for higher bids.

Improv lessons – Everyone enjoys a good sense of humor.

Jewelry-making class – Some places use stone, metal, sea glass, and even dried flowers in their classes.

Music lessons – Piano, guitar, or even lessons on sound-mixing software.

Paint Night at home – Personal painting parties for parents, kids, or whole families.

Perfume-making class – Create one-of-a-kind scents.

Offer bidders the chance to lighten their To-Do list by putting services on the auction block. You can either auction off fixed dollar amounts worth of services or a set number of hours. You can have community members volunteer to provide some of the auctioned services.

Babysitting – A night out for many parents can feel like a mini-vacation.

Dog-walking – The family dog will especially appreciate this item.

Haircut and styling – A gift certificate for new styling products is a perfect add-on to this item.

Housecleaning – A clean home is invaluable for families with busy schedules.

Landscaping and lawn mowing – Getting a break from mowing and landscaping is always appealing.

Makeover with a local stylist – Tips on maintaining a brand-new style are a bonus.

Massages and facials – A little TLC goes a long way.

Mechanic or car-detailing service – Make an older car feel brand new.

Obedience training for dogs – This makes for happier dogs and happier families.

Personal shopper – A great item for those who would rather not spend all day trying on clothes.

Pet grooming – Add a dry shampoo for pets to this item so people can keep their dog smelling fresh between visits.

Pet sitting – Crating can be stressful for pets when families go on vacation.

Board games and jigsaw puzzles – These are a blast for family game nights, rainy days, and downtime on vacation.

Cheese – Present this item with a nice cheeseboard, and people won't stop bidding on the chance to try cheeses from across the globe.

Children's book club – Children will never get bored with new stories every month. (There are also book clubs for adults and young adults.)

Chocolate – Way more variety than what you find by a convenience-store cash register.

Coffee or tea – Adding a travel mug to this item is a nice touch.

Health and wellness boxes – A chance for a calm mind and body comes in the mail monthly.

Hot sauce – Spicy, fruity, or smoky? This club is sure to offer flavor profiles hard to come by anywhere else.

K-beauty skincare boxes – Popular skincare trends will catch people's eyes.

Pet toys of the month – People love pampering their pets.

Sensory toys of the month – Innovative takes on fidget spinners and more.

STEM science club boxes – A new science experiment to try every month is both educational and a lot of fun.

Succulent of the month – Succulents are like potato chips: it's hard to have just one!

Camping adventures – Complete with a s'mores basket.

Disneyland adventure – New magical experiences for kids and nostalgia for parents—Disney vacations are a family staple.

National parks packages – A chance to immerse in awe-inspiring nature will have bidders scrambling for this vacation package.

Dinner with the mayor – This is an opportunity civic-minded auction participants won't pass up.

One-on-one encounters – A meet-and-greet with the chance to chat and get autographs.

Personalized video from a favorite celebrity – This is a sweet gift that people can keep and rewatch whenever they need a little pick-me-up.

VIP experience at an award show or event – Ask around the community to see if anyone has connections to stadiums and theaters that host big events to see if they can donate this experience to charity.

TIP: Make sure to disclose any terms and conditions for auction items so that participants can plan accordingly. The more information that is available to guests, the more confident they'll feel when bidding on items, and the more enjoyable the experience will be for everyone. A few helpful things to look out for:

- Is gratuity included in a massage, restaurant gift certificate, or any other auction item centered on services?
- Is there an expiration date?
- Is there an age restriction?

- Are there blackout dates for when someone can book a vacation package?
- Are there any additional costs once you get there to be aware of?





Adults Only

For people who want an evening out with friends, partners, or by themselves, you can offer all sorts of adults-only items. Throw in a babysitter for an evening, and the winning bidder will be all set.

Beer brewing lessons – Learn how to make a great idea for a new beer into reality.

Brewery or winery tours – For those who would rather leave the brewing and winemaking to the experts.

Casino adventure – Give guests the chance to test their luck.

CrossFit Membership – This is a popular fitness membership for anyone who is looking to improve their stamina and overall health.

Dinner and a movie – Sometimes you don't need a lot of extravagances to have a wonderful evening.

Dinner cruise – Who wouldn't enjoy dinner with pristine views on the water?
